

Moy Viaduct

Constructed in 1887, Moy Viaduct is the last remaining timber bridge on a main line railway in Scotland.

For a number of years the structure had been suffering from severe fungal decay. In 2003 it was sympathetically strengthened and repaired by the installation of a new structure within the framework of the original bridge and treatment of the timbers to prevent further decay.
